## **GUIDE FOR SEPARATING RESIDUAL WASTE**



# RECYCLABLE MATTER (Blue bin)

#### PAPER & CARDBOARD

- Magazines & catalogues
- Newspapers & flyers
- Brown paper and bags
- Paper, envelopes, books
- Corrugated cardboard
- Cardboard boxes flattened
- Foil-lined juice cartons
- Milk and juice cartons
- Shredded paper put in a clear bag & tie
- Do NOT recycle paper or cardboard soiled with oil or grease
- Please remove flyers and newspapers from your Publi-Sac

## **METAL**

- Food tins and aluminium cans rinsed
- Clean aluminium foil and plates
- Metal covers
- All metal containers should be rinsed

## **RIGID PLASTIC**

- Food, household and cosmetic containers
- All plastic items featuring the following logos:



- Plastic toys with **no** metal parts
- Rigid plastic containers should be rinsed.
- Save space in your bin by crushing larger items

## SOFT PLASTIC

- Grocery, shopping, milk, bread bags
- Publi-Sac bags
- Clean plastic wrap
- Put all soft plastics into one bag and tie securely

## **GLASS** (transparent or coloured)

- Jars, vials, bottles (with or without labels)
- Glass containers should be rinsed. Recycle covers separately
- Dishes & drinking glasses are not recyclable.

# COMPOSTABLE GARBAGE (Brown bin or other container)

#### **FOOD RESIDUE**

- 🥩 Fruits & vegetables
- 🏶 Coffee (grinds & filters) and tea bags
- **S** Bread, cereals, pasta
- Meat, poultry (residue and bones)
- Fish and seafood
- 🐝 Dairy products (cheese, butter, etc.)
- 🐝 Egg shells
- Table scraps and foods past their prime
- 🐝 Domestic animal litter
- Cold ashes

## **GREEN RESIDUE**

- Grass
- Dead leaves
- Sod
- Garden soil
- Flowers, plants, weeds
- **S** Gardening residue
- 🥩 Bark, wood shavings, sawdust
- 🐝 Roots

# OTHER

- Papers soiled with food (paper towels, napkins, etc.)
- 🦋 Feathers and hair 🛚 🐚

## RESIDUAL GARBAGE (various containers)

## Matter which cannot be composted or recycled

- Styrofoam (cups, plates) even when featuring the 💰 logo 🗊
- Garden hoses
- Cigarette butts
- Diapers
- Hygienic pads and tampons
- Soiled tissues
- Tarps, swimming pool covers



- Waxed papers
  - Cellophanes
- Soiled plastic wraps («saran»)
- Chip bags
- Dishes and drinking glasses
- Ceramics
- Mirrors
