## Strategic Plan

The lengthy process involved in the preparation of the plan is now complete. It will soon be distributed to all our citizens and will also be available on our website. Our citizens have clearly demonstrated their commitment to the municipality and its future through the high level of participation during the process. Indeed, more than fifty citizens showed up in person in June and we received 163 responses to our in-depth survey.

Some of the main priorities that will guide the Council in the future are a strong commitment to the environment, investment in quality infrastructure, encouragement of community belonging as well as highlighting the exceptional natural sites in Ogden. These results only confirm that actions already taken by the Council and those to come are very consistent with the wishes of the population.

## Road Safety

We have petitioned the Ministry of Transport, with the full support of the Canton de Stanstead as well as the Sûreté du Québec, to reduce the speed limit on Route 247 (Ch. Griffin) from 90 km to 80 km over its entire length. This road is very winding and hilly and is the scene of too many speeding vehicles. Several farms border it and they need to use the road with their machinery, adding to the danger level there. Moreover, the major power outage of January 18 was caused by a vehicle losing control and damaging a power pole.

## Lake Patrol

The Lake Patrol will be provided by Canton de Potton next summer. Subsequent to the MRC's decision to withdraw this service, Potton has stepped up with major investments. Their service proposal, at the same cost as previously with the MRC, will increase the presence of patrols in our area. Their agents have been trained and will be authorised to issue warnings and tickets for the same infractions as before.

The 2025 budget for the Municipality of Ogden was adopted at a special council meeting held on Monday, December 16, 2024.

**Key elements from the 2025 municipal budget include:**

- Expenditures increase of 9.2 % over the 2024 budget;
- Revenue increase of 7.3 % over the 2024 budget;
- Increase of general property tax rate by 2.4 %;
- New tax for the loan bylaw no. 2024-03 (Cedarville road project);
- Use of \$84,104 of the surplus to balance the 2025 budget

#### STRAY CATS AND COLD WEATHER

### NOTICE TO OGDEN PROPERTY OWNERS:

Chartered appraisers Jean-Pierre Cadrin et Associés, mandated by the MRC of Memphrémagog, wish to inform you that letters will shortly be sent to owners of properties that have not been inspected in the last 9 years on the Ogden territory, inviting you to fill out an online inspection form.

One of the mandates the MRC of Memphrémagog is asking them to fulfill is to visit properties to complete inventory maintenance. This involves visiting properties that have not been visited in the last 9 years.

In the interests of fairness, the Act respecting municipal taxation requires assessors to periodically verify the accuracy of the data they have on municipal properties.

The Act respecting municipal taxation and the Standards of Practice of the Ordre des Évaluateurs agréés du Québec allow them to do this in two ways: either by physically visiting the buildings, or by sending a letter to the owner so that he or she can fill out a detailed form that one of their technicians can then validate.

In compliance with section 15 of the Act respecting municipal taxation, they will carry an identity card (with photograph) signed by appraiser Jean-Pierre Cadrin.

Section 15 states: "The assessor or his representative may, in the performance of his duties, visit and examine any property situated in the territory of the local municipality, between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. from Monday to Saturday, except on holidays.

He must carry an identification card, bearing his photograph issued or certified by the clerk of the municipal body responsible for assessment, and must show it on request."

## WINTER IS HERE.

### Don't be a fool - Prepare earlier

#### Prepare for winter storms and severe cold weather

If a winter storm or severe cold is forecast:

- make sure you have enough food, water and fuel;
- carry a sufficient supply of prescription medication;
- clear your roof of snow or have it cleared if necessary.

#### Take precautions during winter storms and severe cold weather

Follow certain safety rules:

- Avoid unnecessary travel and postpone non-essential appointments;
- call vulnerable people to check on their well-being;
- use auxiliary heating systems in accordance with manufacturers' instructions;
- make sure your chimney outlet is not blocked by snow accumulation;
- contact your municipality to report any situation requiring municipal service (branches on the road, etc.);
- listen to the media for instructions from the authorities and to be informed of any service interruptions or exceptional services made available to you.
- Report any power failure to Hydro-Québec at 1 800 790-2424.

#### Watch for frostbite and symptoms of hypothermia

In very cold weather, avoid going outdoors for long periods. If you do go outside, dress accordingly to avoid cold injuries such as frostbite (numbness, paleness and hardness of the affected area). Frostbite can be treated at home, except in severe cases, by slowly warming the affected areas. Avoid rubbing or massaging the affected areas, as this may damage the skin.

Watch out for any symptoms of hypothermia. Hypothermia occurs when body temperature drops below 35°C (95°F). Inside a building, hypothermia may occur when the ambient temperature falls below 15.5°C (60°F).

Symptoms of hypothermia include:

- persistent shivering;
- cold extremities (fingers, toes, nose and ears) and cheeks;

- muscle stiffness, which can lead to lack of coordination;
- abnormal behavior and confusion;
- dizziness and, occasionally, blurred vision.

Physical exertion during intense cold and hypothermia increase the risk of cardiac arrest. Call Info-Santé at 811 for medical advice if you or someone close to you is experiencing symptoms of hypothermia. Call 911 in a medical emergency.

While waiting for help to arrive, take care of a person showing symptoms of hypothermia as follows:

- make sure his or her clothes are dry;
- wrap them loosely in warm blankets, covering their neck and head;
- have her drink a lukewarm, non-alcoholic beverage, as alcohol increases sensitivity to the cold;
- avoid subjecting her to sudden changes in temperature, e.g. taking a hot bath or leaving her near a source of intense heat;
- use a thermometer to monitor temperature changes;
- keep her awake and still.

## WILD BOAR AND EXOTIC DEER ON THE LOOSE: REPORT THEM!

Have you spotted red deer roaming the countryside? Does your neighbor have a few wild boars that roam freely in and out of their enclosure? This is not normal! Wild boar and exotic cervids (red deer, elk, fallow deer and sikas) are animals kept in captivity and must remain so. If they escape from their enclosure, report them promptly!

### What to do if you spot them in the wild?

If you think you've seen exotic wild boar or deer in the wild, report your sighting, even if you're not sure of the species, to SOS Poaching - Wildlife Emergency, by e-mail at [centralesos@mffp.gouv.qc.ca](mailto:centralesos@mffp.gouv.qc.ca) or at 1 800 463-2191.

Wild boars and exotic cervids that have escaped from their enclosures must be removed from the wild by a specialized MELCCFP team. To facilitate the team's work, please provide the following information:

- The date, time and location of the sighting (address, intersection, GPS coordinates);
- The number of animals observed and whether they are accompanied by juveniles.

Include photos if possible.

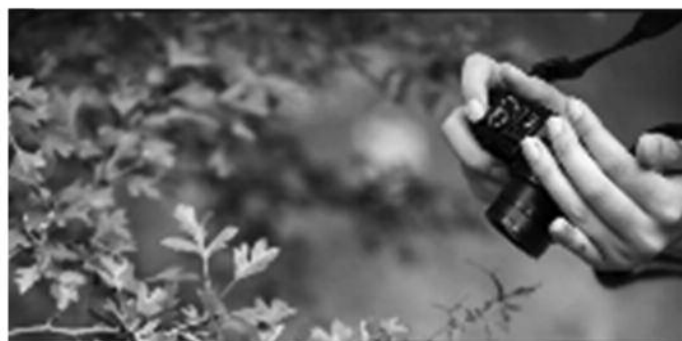
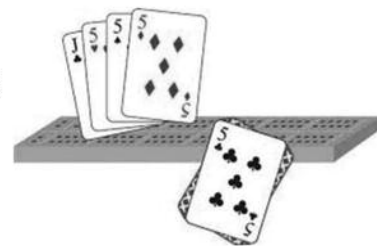
