#### WHO ARE YOUR MEMBERS OF COUNCIL?

Mr. David Lépine (mayor): Mr. Lépine has been in Ogden since 1965, having owned property since 1977 and as a permanent resident since 2020. He was instrumental in creating the Tomkin Creek Nature Reserve. His priorities will be citizen services (roads, garbage, snow clearing etc.), protection of our natural environment and systematic management of development. Transparency and communications with our citizens will be first and foremost in his actions.

Mr. Michael Sudlow (councillor no. 1): Mr. Sudlow is a widely travelled veteran with 32 years in municipal politics. He is a retired educator with degrees in engineering, and 50 years of competitive distance running, which naturally leads him to seek more local public off-road recreational opportunities to support a healthy lifestyle, and to make environmental protection a priority.

Mr. Michel Lesage (councillor no. 2): Mr. Lesage has lived in Ogden for 10 years. A civil engineer who graduated from l'école Polytechnique de l'Université de Montréal, he has, during his career, worked in various municipalities including Drummondville and Longueuil. Before running for the position of Councillor, he was a citizen member of the municipality's Land Use Advisory Committee (CCU). He wishes to put his experience to work for the citizens of Ogden.

Mr. Gilbert Boileau (councillor no. 3): Mr. Boileau has worked in more than 15 cities in North America as an executive in public and private companies. With a proven track record in management and business process improvement as well as in mergers, acquisitions and start-ups, he has been a resident of Ogden for over 20 years and intends to use his vast experience to bring a healthy and respectful vision to the municipality of Ogden.

**Mr. William Scott (councillor no. 4)**: Mr. Scott intends to leverage his extensive experience in senior information technology political analysis, as well as volunteer and fundraising activities. His goal is to assist the mayor and fellow council members in improving Ogden's quality of life.

#### **High Speed Internet in Ogden!**

Cogeco Connexion and DERYtelecom have set up a validation tool to identify the addresses that will be impacted by the Operation High Speed project. Ogden citizens can go to this web page right now to confirm that their address is included. #### **Proposed zoning changes**

Ogden and 16 other municipalities are part of the Memphremagog MRC. The MRC has just adopted a new Urban Plan (SADD) which is to be sanctioned by the Quebec government in order to come into effect. We will have to comply minimally with this new plan. This will entail a complete revision of Ogden's Urban Plan dated 1999. We will be soliciting our citizens' input in the completion of this review during 2022.

Since 2020 Ogden has seen a major increase in real estate activity which, if left unchecked, could well alter the rural and tranquil nature of our beautiful municipality. With that in mind the Council has decided to change the subdivision bylaw in order to better control this development. In certain more sensitive zones, the following changes will apply to new subdivisions:

- Minimum lot size will go from 8,000 sqm to 12,000 sqm
- All subdivisions will carry the obligation to cede 10 % of the property, or the equivalent, to the municipality for parks

These changes are included in the notice of motion of November 15th and will be incorporated into our bylaws soon.



#### **SAFE HOLIDAYS**

The holiday season will soon be here and that means trees, garlands and lights as part of the decor, both inside and outside your home. Because we want you and your loved ones to spend quality time in a safe environment, here are a few fire prevention tips for this festive time of year.

#### **Christmas Tree Prevention:**

It only takes 30 seconds for a tree to light on fire. It is thus very important to take the following precautions to avoid such a situation:

- If you are using a natural tree, it is preferable to choose a freshly-cut tree. The needles are green and do not fall off easily;
- · Opt for an artificial tree;
- Slice off the bottom of the tree, even if you buy a precut tree. The new cut will help the tree absorb humidity;
- Place the tree in a water recipient that is always kept full;
- Install the tree at least 1 metre from any heat source;
- Never decorate the tree with candles;
- Always shut off the lights when you leave your home.

#### **Decoration Prevention:**

- Use lights that are CSA or ULC approved;
- Ensure lights are in good condition;
- Check manufacturer instructions when installing Christmas lights;
- Do not use decorations designed for indoor use outside;

- Use approved extension cords;
- Never place extension cords in a high-traffic area. Install the tree and other electric decorations near electrical outlets, so as to avoid using extension cords;
- Do not hide extension cords under carpets or area rugs;
- Do not pass extension cords in doorways. The cord's insulation could be damaged if the door is closed on it.
- Do not overload outlets or extension cords. Use a power bar instead.
- Only use one extension cord at a time. Do not plug extension cords end-to-end.

#### Other Advice:

- Alway keep walkways free, both indoors and outside;
- Identify the exits when you visit family, friends or reception halls. The main building entrance may not be accessible in the case of an emergency;
- Ensure that smoke detectors are functioning properly.
   Smoke detectors are the fastest and most efficient way to detect a fire and save lives;
- Know the location of fire extinguishers and ensure they are functional at all times. However, in the case of fire, never take risks. Call firefighters immediately.
